NOTE: Several stores around the country have been selling Deccagones; these are re-pressings and did not come from us. The sound quality is slightly worse but a much easier way to tell the originals from the reprints is the labels; the bootlegs have a taller and thinner Deccagone logo. Also, several LPs have already come out featuring the released Deccagones plus old filler. Don't waste your money; there will be a Deccagone album featuring all the tracks when the series is completed.

As noted above by Joe Pope, it didn't take long for other bootleggers to knock off the Deccagone singles, with several variations in vinyl color, label style, and matrix numbers available. The rival LP he refers to is *The Deccagone Sessions* (see Volume One), issued by Smilin' Ears. Pope would indeed press a very limited-quantity album using the same master tapes as the singles, called *The Deccagones* [matrix CX-369 A/B], but not before Audifon beat him to the punch (see page 34).
